In accordance with an ancient and much venerated custom, and in conformity with the recent Proclamation of the President of the United States, I hereby appoint THURSDAY, THE 18TH OF NOVEMBER, next, as a day of Public Thanksgiving and Praise; and do earnestly request the good people, one and all, throughout the State, to lay aside their customary avocations and meet together in their usual places of worship, and there return thanks to Almighty God, who rules and governs the universe, for the bountiful mercies he has bestowed upon us, and entreat him to grant us a continuance of these blessings.

Let us praise Him, that both in our domestic and foreign relations we have been permitted to live in peace, and in the enjoyment of social order. Let us praise Him for the abundant harvest and fruitful fields that have gladdened the hearts of the husbandmen. For the general good health that has prevailed throughout the land. For the harmony and good will that exists among the States of the Union, after the long and destructive war. For the prosperous condition of the various industries of the country. For the completion of great pub-

lic improvements which will increase our commerce and extend civilization.
