APROCLAMATION.

The Emoft glocious Governor of the World, which to Mercies extend to all his Works, having in infinite Goodness defined innumerable Bleffings on a methanicathy People; at heromen us with unergued Gratitude to ented and his bis Nation in the great Congregation, to feed the glocious Honor of his variety, and of all his wonderful Works, and abundantly to unter the Memory of his Goodney's, though involved in a bloody and obfinate Work, which infinite Worldow has be permitted for his own Glory and our Correll on a set has not for taken, but it most remarkably before in many respective. Corr Councils and public Measures are celleding Firmings sour Colland Polymore I domine the invisitates—the Arms of the Country with in our or most farguine Expectations seem Labours crowned with great Planty of Frontish both for Main and Beast—uncomment Mealth in most Parts of the Land through the Year-and as the highest Instance of Drowne Goodway, we emby the Golfiel and its Privileges, and the fire World of Revolution to Teach as the instance for which his Name found be praised.

THAVE therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of the Council, and at the Define of the Representatives in General Court affembled, to app it, and do hereby appoint Thursday the Twentieth Day of November next to be observed as a Day of public Praise and Thanksgiving throughout this State. D. eating and exhorting all Denominations and Orders of People, to bless the Most High GOD for his great Wisdom and Goodness, the mighty Acts of his Povidence by which we are defended, and for all the Favours and Comports of Life. That we have a Plenty of the Fruits of the Earth almost unparallelled, and though often diffurbed by the Alarm of War, had Opportunity for Ingathering them. To praise the Sovereign Lord of Life for the Health of sur Countenance, and the Vigour of our Days - that the Inhabitants, and especially our Soldiery in the Field, have been preserved from more I Sickness, and enabled to endure the Fatigues of a Campaign with uncommon Firmness and Spirit. To render unseigned Praise to the Lond of Host's, that he hath appeared for us in the Mount of Difficulty, and Day of War-inspired our Officers both General and Subordinate with fuch Wildom and Fortitude, and our Soldiers with fuch Bravery, that their Arms have been terrible to the common Enemy, and with the Bleffing of Heaven, the Means of procuring us to great Salvation. And while devout Praise is rendered for every Inflance of Military Success, to take special Notice of God's Goodness in the Defeat and Conquest of our Enemies in the Northern Department; a Bleffing in which the States of New England are especially interested. That when our Enemy trusting in the Strength of their own Wildom and Power, and the mighty preparation or war, the extend us with every Evil that Humanisty can deprecate; the Lord beheld and confounded them, bringing Salvation out of those Events, which alarmed our apprehentions. And especially to sing of Goodness, and the Glory of his Perickions in Redeeming Men--permitting us to enjoy Christian Previliges, and to he pe for a happy Immortality; and for every Bleshing by which the Glory of his Mercy is magnified. Likewite to offer fervent Prayers to the Molt High Goo, for the Protection and Profestity of the United States of America; that the General Congress may be tavortied with the Divine presence, and all necessary Wildom, I idelity and Fortitude ... That God would grant unto each of the United States Peace. Tranquility and the Bieflings of a well-regulated and righteous, Government; and that the Inhabitants of this State particularly, may know and serve the Loan, 25 the Multitude of his Mercies demands ... that our Legislature may ever be directed by the Wissom of the Mott High, and all the Rulers of the People cloathed with Fidelity and Knowledge--that Temperance, Sobriety, Juffre, Benevolence and Obedience to Laws both Divine and Fluman may obtain through the Land-that the Lord of Holls would continue to blefs our Arms, make our Officers wife and brave, our Soldiers firm and undawnted, grant Health in their Fincampments, Prefervation and Victory in Battle, and give them all the Virtues of pure and undefiled Religion. That the Interests of America by Sea and I and may be advanced. The War brought to a speedy, safe and honourable Issue. That every last ance of Divine Judgment, or of God's great Mercy may excite Fiety, Devotion, and holy Obedience, -- That our Churches may be purified, and bleffed with a pious and able Ministry... that the Interests of Literature be advanced... that the Indian Natives of this Land be taught the Knowledge and Obedience of the only true God, and the Saviour of Mankind---that the Holy Spirit be proved out on all Mankind, and the World be filled with Rightsoufnets, Peace, Love and the Glory of the Lord.
